- Nominees need not be SAFE members.
- Nominations should be for specific awards, for which the nominee has not already been recognized (see list of prior award recipients).
- A SAFE member may submit as many nominations as he/she feels appropriate.
- Extensive or elaborate justification is not necessary.
- The deadline for the submission of nominations is close of business (West Coast Time) Friday July 23, 2021. Late or incomplete submissions will not be accepted no exceptions.
